Some of these models are already being implemented, while others are still being treated as "visions for the future" in Germany". Trained medical assistants



Medical assistants can undergo additional training qualifying them to relieve doctors of certain duties. Routine medical duties, such as wound treatment, home check-up visits, and medical documentation, can then be performed by the Trained Medical Assistant (TMA). However, the doctor is still the responsible party. TMAs can relieve doctors of certain duties, giving physicians more time to treat patients in their office.

2 Patient bus



Patient buses are a means of transportation designed to ensure patient access to the doctor's offices by public transport. Patient buses take patients from remote areas of the municipality to the doctor's office and back. The operating hours of the patient buses are aligned with those of the doctor's offices.

Mobile physicians' office



The mobile physicians' office is a fully-equipped doctor's office integrated in a converted camper van or minibus. The doctor can drive the mobile medical practice to remote areas where there is no local general practitioner. A mobile physicians' office is equipped like a normal primary care practice and provides a first point of contact for medical care.

Remote treatment (telemedicine)



In telemedicine, patients do not present in the doctor's office physically, but receive remote treatment and advice from a physician via telecommunication and information technology. This saves patients from having to travel long distances. Contact between telemedicine patients and doctors takes place via email, telephone and/or videoconferencing. Based on the reported symptoms of disease, the doctor decides whether to issue the patient a drug prescription or sick leave. If an examination that cannot be performed remotely is needed, the patient must schedule an appointment and present to the doctor in person.
