Intervention

1. Patient enters routine appointment

- 2. Health professional raises the topic of bowel cancer screening
- Patient is receptive to conversation.
 Concerns about screening or any other issues are discussed
 - 4. Information leaflet is given to the patient
- 5. Patient contacts the Scottish Bowel Screening Centre and asks for a replacement FOBt kit
- Patient completes and returns the FOBt kit (non-responder becomes a responder to bowel screening)

Potential bottlenecks

Health professional decides it is not appropriate to approach eligible patient (e.g. too many issues to discuss already). No intervention is carried out.

Patient is approached about the issue of bowel screening, but is not receptive to the conversation and the health professional does not proceed with the intervention.

Patient engages in conversation, but is not interested in receiving the leaflet which offers the opportunity to ask for a replacement FOBt kit. The intervention ends.

Patient does not request a replacement FOBt kit (with or without the development of a written implementation intentions plan).

Patient does not return the completed replacement FOBt kit.
