while remaining intramural employees
 NIH will maintain control and oversight of licensed intellectual property, ensuring that investigators actively translate to the public in a transparent and ethically responsible manner

Intramural investigators will be permitted to license inventions or discoveries made in their NIH laboratories and to form companies for commercialization,

The program will <u>not</u> require new funding, as investigators will utilize current laboratory space and resources
 NIH will collect royalty payments on all successful projects and these monies

will be funneled back into biomedical research; and, investigators will subsidize

Investigators will be permitted to utilize their intramural laboratories as

locations for their company to enable seamless integration of efforts

- their own salaries and research support as their companies develop

 NIH as an institution will carefully evaluate the effectiveness of the percubator as a general method for supporting research and delivery in government and other settings
- other settings

 The percubator program will provide entrepreneurship training for students, fellows, and investigators, with the goal of producing a cadre of researchers who can translate laboratory and clinical advances into public benefit
