Canadian CT Head Fule

CT head is only required for minor head injury patients with any one of these findings:

High Risk (for Neurological Intervention)

- **1.** GCS score < 15 at 2 hrs after injury
- 2. Suspected open or depressed skull fracture
- 3. Any sign of basal skull fracture*
- 4. Vomiting \geq 2 episodes
- 5. Age \geq 65 years

Medium Risk (for Brain Injury on CT)

- 6. Amnesia before impact \ge 30 min
- 7. Dangerous mechanism ** (pedestrian, occupant ejected, fall from elevation)

*Signs of Basal Skull Fracture

 hemotympanum, 'racoon' eyes, CSF otorrhea/ rhinorrhea, Battle's sign

** Dangerous Mechanism

- pedestrian struck by vehicle
- occupant ejected from motor vehicle
- fall from elevation ≥ 3 feet or 5 stairs

Rule Not Applicable If:

- Non-trauma cases
- GCS < 13
- Age < 16 years
- Coumadin or bleeding disorder
- Obvious open skull fracture
