This process takes place within a complex system of interactions between researchers and knowledge users which may vary in intensity, complexity and level of engagement depending on the nature of the research and the findings as well as the needs of the particular

knowledge user.

Other terms commonly used are knowledge transfer, knowledge exchange, research utilization, and dissemination and implementation (US).

Realist syntheses, narrative syntheses, meta-analyses, meta-syntheses and practice guidelines are all forms of synthesis.
